#### **About ALPTREES**

It is a "transnational cooperation project for Sustainable Use and Management of Non-Native Trees in Urban, Peri-Urban and Forest Ecosystems in the Alpine space". The main objective of the ALPTREES project is to enhance the protection, conservation and the ecological connectivity of Alpine ecosystems. On 1st of October 2019 the project was selected to be funded by the Interreg, Alpine Space Program. The project strives to provide a transnational strategy to develop a decision support system on responsible use and management of non-native trees in the Alpine space promoting stakeholder cooperation. Moreover the project aims to develop policy recommendations for non-native tree species in the Alpine space.

#### Non-native trees (NNT)

Non-native trees, also known as "nonindigenous", "alien", "introduced", "allochthonous" or "exotic" trees, are tree species, breeds or hybrids in the Alpine Space region whose presence there is the result of human activity by way of intentional or accidental introduction. By contrast, native trees are tree species of natural, post-glacial forest development in the Alpine Space region. For example Red Oak and Douglas fir are some of the non-native trees prevalent in the Alpine space:

# **Kick-Off Meeting**

The project ALPTREES started with a kick-off meeting on November 14th and 15th in 2019 at BFW, the Austrian Research Centre for Forests in Vienna, Austria. Together with our 12 project partners from Austria, Germany, Slovenia, Italy and France, the project strives to develop a strategy for sustainable use and management of nonnative trees in the Alpine region.
